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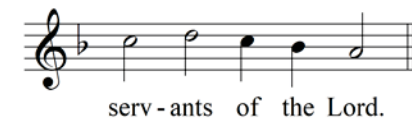
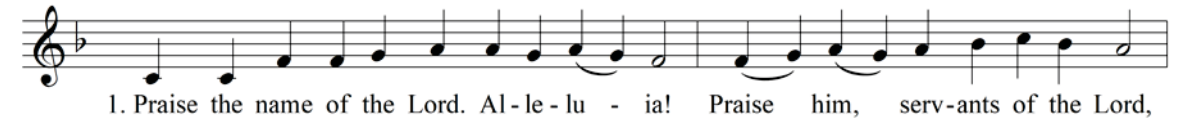
Matins (Abbreviated)

The deacon stands before the Holy Doors and intones:

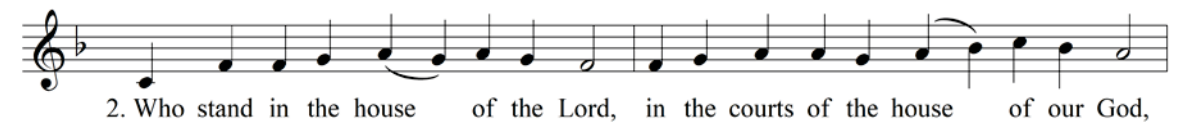
Deacon: Through the prayers of our holy fathers, O Lord Jesus Christ our God, have mercy on us.

The deacon opens the Holy Doors, and, while the Polyeleos is sung, incenses the Holy Table, the icon screen, the church, and the people, preceded by a candlebearer. The cantor sings the verses, the people sing the refrain.


On certain feasts, the Polyeleos is followed by the Festal Exaltation, the Little Litany, and Sessional Hymn III. This material will be found on the leaflet supplement. During the singing of the Festal Exaltation, the icon of the feast (if one be had) is solemnly carried in procession from the holy table, through the Holy Doors, and enthroned on the Tetrapod, where it is censed during the singing of the Exaltation.

The deacon incenses the whole Church as usual while the people sing the refrain and the deacon chants the verses.





Res-ur-rec-tion. By enduring the Cross for us, he de-stroyed Death by death.


Canticle of the Theotokos


The ra - diant angel stand-ing by the grave cried out to the oint-ment -
