BISHOP KURT'S NEW MAY 26, 2021 COVID GUIDELINES: Beginning today, Sunday, June 6th, the dispensation from attending Divine Liturgy is revoked within the Eparchy of Passaic. Watching a live-stream service does not fulfill the obligation to attend the Eucharist. Anyone is relieved of this obligation for a serious reason such as sickness, immobility, fear, caring for someone else, or to protect your own health or the heath of others. We will continue to distribute communion using single-use spoons. People in the congregation do not have to wear a mask. Social distancing is still encouraged. No one should ask whether or not someone is vaccinated. Hand sanitizer will continue to be available for your use. Our church will continue to be cleaned and sanitized. The collection basket will continue to be on the table, in the back of our Temple, for donations.
